- 4. If possible, use winning cases that address similar topics to those assigned each year.
- 5. Encourage students to use their imagination. What initially sounds like an outrageous idea can be refocused into an excellent case.
- 6. Refer often to the rules and topics. It can be easy to wander off topic or miss an important instruction in the directions.
- 7. Proofread constantly. Don't be afraid to ask other teachers for help with the editing.
